Practice Overview

Cara is developing a broad commercial chancery practice across Chambers' core areas of expertise. She is regularly instructed to appear as sole counsel in the High Court and County Court, as well as part of a larger counsel team, and has been involved in disputes with cross-border and international elements. Cara also has experience in a range of advisory work.

Recent examples of notable work include:

- Acting as junior counsel for the Defendant (led by [James Bailey QC](#)) in the *Gray v Hurley* litigation, a dispute relating to the beneficial ownership of property held in joint names purchased by the Claimant during the parties' romantic relationship, allegedly as a result of undue influence. To date Cara has been involved in a jurisdictional challenge which raised a number of novel conflicts of laws issues (*Gray v Hurley* [2019] EWHC 1636 (QB)), and in proceedings for an anti-suit and proprietary freezing order.
- Acted in a dispute over the ownership of bearer shares in a number of offshore corporations, which included issues of cross-border succession and trusts law (led by [Zoë Barton](#) and [Jack Watson](#)).
- A secondment to Stephenson Harwood LLP, working in the private client and pensions teams. She advised in a number of international trusts and probate matters, and was heavily involved in the preparation of a pensions negligence/rectification claim.
- Advising the Defendant in a possession claim raising issues of beneficial ownership in the property and proprietary estoppel (led by [Emily McKechnie](#)).
- Advising the beneficiary of a will trust on claims available against the executors and trustees for breach of fiduciary duty, as well as on a disciplinary complaint against the professional trustee involved.
- Advising and acting in a number of shareholder disputes, including disputes pertaining to beneficial ownership of shares, unfair prejudice actions, and derivative actions.
- Regularly appearing in the winding up court, and in bankruptcy proceedings.

She won numerous academic prizes, including the Dean's List for overall excellence in her final year and the Richardson Prize for the highest result out of students on the law with language course.
